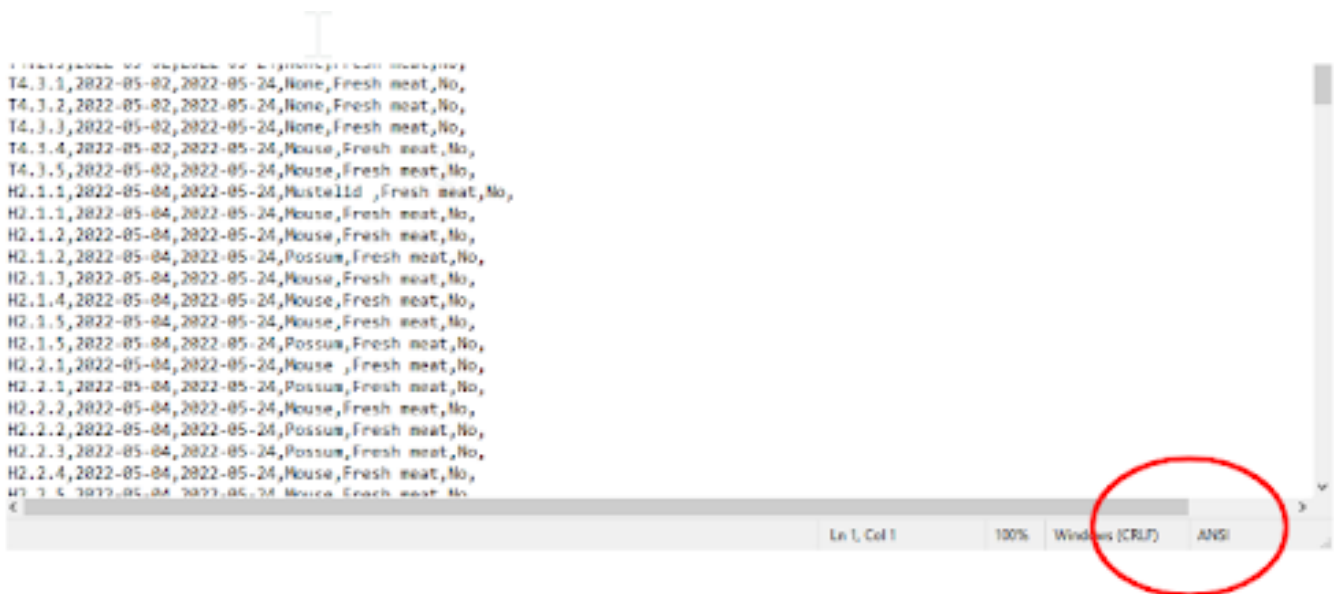


# Why can't I import data? it says I'm not using the correct file encoding.

If your CSV file is not being accepted and it says "Source file is not in UTF-8 encoding", you may need to download it using another file code. In the case below ANSI needed to be substituted with Windows 1254



**start\_date** (required): The date and time of the record. Dates must be in ISO 8601 format, e.g:

2022-08-09 08:53

**end\_date** (optional): The end date of the record, if left out, will be set to the same value as the start date.
